



EVIDENCE OF AGE

The following records will be considered to establish date of birth:

- Certificate of birth obtained from public or hospital records made at time of birth or shortly thereafter.
- Certificate of infant baptism or of baptism at an age at which there would not likely be any material error.
- Copy of the page of the family register of births on which the date of birth appears. The copy is to contain all the entries on such page made and certified to by a Notary Public. The record should be an old one preferably one made at the time of birth of the persons enumerated or shortly thereafter.

When the evidence suggested above does not exist, consideration will be given to the following and as many such records as possible should be secured.

- School record.
- Confirmation record.
- Life Insurance or lodge record at least 10 years old.
- Naturalization record or passport at least 10 years old.
- Armed Forces discharge record.
- Certificate of marriage at least 10 years old.
- Census record showing earliest available record of age.
